Northern Goshawk Accipiter gentilis

hypothetical, unsubstantiated

A large raptor flying rapidly over Kilauea Point, Kaua'i, 25 Jan 2002 was reported with description as a Northern Goshawk. The description may not have eliminated a large falcon and we consider the occurrence of Northern Goshawk in the Hawaiian Islands unlikely. They are an uncommon breeder in subarctic and n. temperate N. America and Eurasia, ranging S in winter to n. Mexico, n. Africa and Burma (AOU 1998).
