# Xenus cinereus

#### non-breeding visitor, vagrant

monotypic

The Terek Sandpiper breeds across c. Russia and winters in the S Hemisphere from S Africa to Australia (Dement'ev and Gladkov 1951c, Cramp and Simmons 1983, Higgins and Davies 1996, AOU 1998). Migrants and vagrants have been recorded E in the Pacific Basin to Yap (Pratt et al. 1987, Wiles 2005) and in Alaska, British Columbia, and California (AOU 1998, CBRC 2007). In the Hawaiian Islands there is a single record from the *Southeastern Hawaiian Islands*, a bird present in a flooded field near Kahuku, *O'ahu* 9 Jan-6 Mar 2014 (Pohlman and VanderWerf 2014; HRBP 6399-6402 published *NAB* 68:444). Terek Sandpiper was accepted by the HBRC to the Hawaiian Island Checklist in Sep 2014.
