Family CORETHRELLIDAE

Corethrellidae is a monogeneric family of culicid-like flies found world-wide. Larvae of extant forms are restricted to small bodies of water such as leaf axils and others isolated at the edges of bogs or small ponds. Adult females have biting mouthparts. Some feed on the blood of male frogs after being attracted to them by their calls.

The oldest fossil described thus far is from the Oligocene/Miocene Dominican amber (Borkent & Szadziewski, 1992).
