Family LONCHOPTERIDAE

Lonchopterids, commonly called spear-winged flies, are a small but widely distributed family of flies comprised of approximately 35 species worldwide. Adults of extant forms are found in shady, humid and/or semiaquatic habitats. Immature stages are found in detritus in moist conditions.

No described fossils of this family are known. Rohdendorf (1962: 340) recorded undetermined material of the genus *Lonchoptera* (as "*Musidora*") from Baltic amber, though Peterson (1987) appears to question this record.
