A REPLACEMENT NAME FOR SALDULA USINGERI COBBEN, 1980

In 1980 I described Saldula usingeri (Heteroptera, Saldidae) from Molokai and Maui in the Hawaiian Islands (Pac. Insects 22(1–2): 21). It appears that this name had already been in use for a California species described by Polhemus (1967, Proc. Entomol. Soc. Wash. 69: 346–348). Therefore, I hereby propose the replacement name Saldula robertusingeri Cobben, new name, for S. usingeri Cobben, 1980, nec Polhemus.—R.H. This is the 4th part in Dr. Nielson's world revision of the leafhoppers in the subfamily Coelidinae. The tribe Coelidini, covered in this monograph, has the widest distribution of any tribe treated thus far, occurring in all zoogeographical regions except the Nearctic and Palaearctic. The tribe is redefined, and descriptions and illustrations are provided for 186 species; 35 of the 39 known genera and 133 of the 186 valid species are newly described. A separate checklist, with synonyms, is given for all genera and species of the tribe.
