## REPLACEMENT NAME FOR SYRPHOIDES EVENHUIS (DIPTERA: BOMBYLIIDAE)

Abstract. A new name, Eristalopsis, is proposed for the preoccupied genus Syrphoides Evenhuis, 1983, nec Syrphoides Hippa, 1968.

In my article on the Bombyliinae of Australia (Evenhuis, 1983, Int. J. Entomol. 25: 206–14), I proposed a new genus for those bombyliid taxa that characteristically have eristaline-like patterns on the abdominal terga (Syrphoides Evenhuis, type-species: Bombylius byrrhus Bowden). This genus is, however, preoccupied by Syrphoides Hippa, 1968 (Syrphidae). A replacement name is thus needed for the junior homonym. I propose the name Eristalopsis.

The new name refers to the likeness of these bombyliid species to those of *Eristalis* Latreille: -opsis = "like, having the appearance of" combined with *Eristalis*. The gender is feminine.
