A Revised Checklist of the Gyrinidae (Insecta: Coleoptera) of New Guinea and Proximal Islands, with Nomenclatural Notes and Addenda¹

Abstract. A revised and updated checklist of all species of Gyrinidae currently described from New Guinea and proximal islands is provided, with updated genus and subgenus assignments, annotations, corrections, and notes on the proper orthography for certain species.

INTRODUCTION

An initial checklist of the Gyrinidae, or whirligig beetles, of New Guinea and closely proximal islands was provided by Polhemus (2011) as an appendix to a paper which otherwise consisted of ecological and biogeographic information for 16 species of Dineutini occurring in this region. The checklist was added to the original paper as a last-minute addendum, at the insistence of the editor. As such, it was hastily prepared and inadequate-ly proofed, and as a result contained certain errors, which were not detected by the author, the editor, or two peer-reviewers. These are corrected in the current version provided here.

In particular, as noted in the ICZN *Code of Zoological Nomenclature (Code)* Article 32.5.2, a name published with a diacritical or other mark, ligature, apostrophe or hyphen must be corrected. In the case of names published prior to 1985 based upon a German word with an umlaut sign, the umlaut is deleted and the letter "e" is inserted after the vowel originally bearing the umlaut. If there is any doubt as to whether the name is based on a German word, this correction is still to be applied. In the original checklist (Polhemus, 2011) this requirement of the Code was overlooked, but the necessary corrections are made and noted in the current version.

In addition to these basic corrections, a recent revision of species concepts in *Rhomborhynchus* (Gustafson & Miller, 2016) coupled with significant revisions to genus and subgenus assignments across the Dineutini based on phylogenetic analysis by these same authors (Gustafson & Miller, 2017) have rendered the original version of this check-list taxonomically obsolete. This new version therefore follows the revised arrangement of species concepts and higher categories set forth in these studies.

REVISED CHECKLIST OF THE GYRINIDAE OF NEW GUINEA AND NEARBY ISLANDS

Genus Macrogyrus Régimbart, 1882

Note: Based on the work of Gustafson & Miller (2017), the New Guinea species previously assigned to the subgenera *Tribologyrus* and *Ballogyrus* are now held under the nominate subgenus *Macrogyrus*. These same authors also note that for *Macrogyrus* as a whole: "The New Guinean fauna and those of the surrounding islands are in desperate need of revision following the work of Ochs (1955), in which the few known species were divided into numerous subspecies, from disparate locations in New Guinea, based on few specimens. The work of Ochs (1955), including no illustrations, nondiscrete morphological characters and excessive splitting of species, has made the identification of New Guinean specimens exceptionally difficult."

Genus Dineutus Macleay, 1825

Note: There has been confusion as to the correct orthography of this name in the literature. The original spelling as proposed by Macleay (1825) was *Dineutus*, but many subsequent American authors used the incorrect subsequent spelling "*Dineutes*" for both extant and fossil taxa.

Note: Based on the work of Gustafson & Miller (2017), the New Guinea species previously assigned to the genus *Spinosodineutes* are now held under the nominate subgenus *Cyclous*.

Subgenus Rhomborhynchus Ochs, 1926

Note: *Rhomborhynchus* was formerly held as a subgenus of *Porrorhynchus* but was transferred as a subgenus under *Dineutus* by Gustafson & Miller (2017).

depressus depressus (Régimbart, 1892) Widespread in New Guinea
Note: Ochs (1955) recognized 5 subspecies of *Dineutes (Rhomborhynchus) depressus*: the nominate *D. (R). depressus depressus* Régimbart from Dilo, in the Papuan Peninsula; *D. (R.) depressus jamurensis* Ochs, 1955 from Lake Yamur in northwestern New Guinea; *D. (R.) depressus versteegi* Ochs, 1955 from the Beaufort River of south-central New Guinea; *D. (R.) depressus moszkowskii* Ochs, 1955 from the Van Daalen River in the Mamberamo Basin; and *D. (R.) depressus misoolensis* Ochs, 1955 from Misool Island. Gustafson & Miller (2016), after examination of the holotypes coupled with a critical morphological analysis, synonymized all of these subspecies under *D. (R.) depressus*, with the exception of *D. (R.) misoolensis*, which they elevated to full species status.

Genus Gyrinus Geoffroy, 1762

Subgenus Gyrinus Geoffroy, 1762

Note: Geoffroy's original use of the name *Gyrinus* in 1767 was rejected by ICZN Opinion 228 (ICZN 1954) in which it was ruled that Geoffroy's names as a whole were not available for nomenclatorial purposes, because he did not apply the principles of binominal nomenclature, as required by Proviso (b) to Article 25 of the *Règles*. However, this ruling also invited specialists in the groups involved to submit applications to the Commission for the validation, under the Plenary Powers, of any name published in it, the rejection of which would, in their opinion, lead to instability or confusion in the nomenclature of the group concerned. In the case of *Gyrinus*, an application was made, and the name under Geoffroy's authorship was conserved under ICZN Opinion 1754 (ICZN, 1994a).
